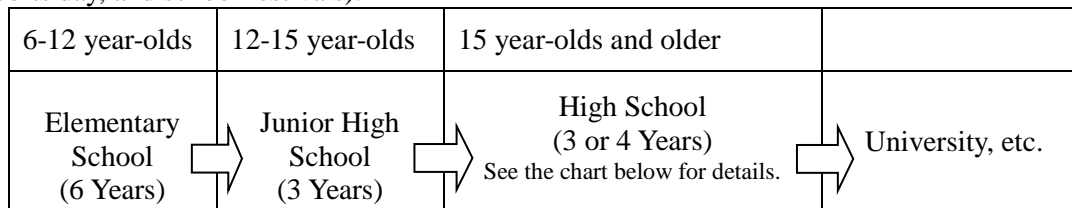

1 What are High Schools in the Japanese Educational System?

High schools are generally 3 to 4-year schools for people who have graduated from junior high school. Unlike elementary and junior high schools, you must pass an exam to enter high school. Even after you enter high school, you may not be able to proceed to the next grade or graduate if you don't perform well in class.

High schools also offer various club activities and events throughout the year (such as single-day and overnight field trips, sports day, and school festivals).



※Students born in April through the following March are in the same grade.

3 School Information Meetings

Each school holds information meetings. It is highly recommended to attend these meetings before you make your final decision for application so that you can see the school and ask questions in person. There are also joint school information meetings that provide opportunities for students to obtain information from many schools at once.

4 Entrance Examinations

5 Those Who Have Not Graduated from Junior High Schools in Japan

A “Qualification Certificate” (*Shutsugan Shikaku Nintei*) is necessary for taking the examination when you apply to public high schools (prefectural AND municipal).

Please be sure to consult the Prefectural School Management and Personnel Division (*Kenritsu Gakkou Jinji-Ka Gakuji Tantou*), Saitama Prefecture Board of Education for requirements before applying.

※Please contact each school if you plan to take entrance examinations for private schools.

6 Special Selection Process for Non-Japanese Students

The following 12 schools offer exams for non-Japanese students who have lived in Japan for only a short time.

Academic Achievement Examination (Math and English) and Interview

※Examinations have the same questions as the standard Japanese exams with furigana added above kanji. Interview will be conducted in Japanese.

※Even if there are only a few applicants, you may not be accepted if your examination results do not meet the required school standards.

(2) Exemptions of School Fees

Some high schools have a system of exempting a student from paying entrance fees and miscellaneous fees. Please consult with teachers before or right after your enrollment to school.

8 Financial Support Systems for High School Expenses

Various educational financial support systems are offered for students in need. There are student loans that require repayment and scholarships which do not require repayment. Decisions are made by taking the financial status of the family and reference from the student's school into consideration.

(1) Scholarships (You do NOT need to repay any money you receive.)

- High School Enrollment Support Fund (for students attending public or private high schools, etc.)
- Saitama Prefecture Subsidy to Support Parents of Private School Students (for students and guardians who live in Saitama; student must attend a private senior high school in Saitama)

- Stipend for National/Public School Students (for students attending national or public schools; guardian must live in Saitama)

- Stipend for Private School Students (for students attending private senior high schools; guardian must live in Saitama)

(2) Student Loans (You DO need to repay all money you receive.)

- Saitama Prefecture Student Loan Program for Senior High School Students (guardian must live in Saitama)

(3) Other Student Loans and Scholarships

- Municipal Scholarships: Some municipalities provide scholarships. Please ask the municipal offices for information.
